Learned counsel for the Government of National Capital Territory, Delhi, AIIMS and MCD state that they will be filing the affidavits specifying the steps taken for implementation of the report of Dr.R.K.Sharma. The Government of National Capital Territory, Delhi shall also specify in detail the present stage of implementation of various recommendations with reference to annexure RC to its affidavit filed on 31st October, 2002.

There is no appearance on behalf of the UOI. Even the requisite affidavit has not been filed. It appears that the UOI is not interested in improving the mortuaries attached to its hospitals. In the circumstances, we consider it appropriate to impose costs of Rs.20,000/- on the UOI. We order accordingly. The UOI shall deposit the costs of Rs.20,000/- before

the next date. The costs shall be made over by the registry to the Government of National Capital Territory, Delhi for the improvement of mortuaries. List the matter on 2nd December, 2002.
